Jefferson born in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, October 18, 1934; parents' education went only through fifth and third grade; mother was a housewife, father was chauffeur; Jefferson works on the East Baton Rouge Parish School Board; McKinley prepared him for future employment; attended McKinley from 1949 to 1953; describes typical day at McKinley; served in air force for four years; importance of sports at McKinley; belonged to Hi-Y Club and was a soloist in the McKinley choir; Jefferson was an average student; role models included Martin Luther King, Junior, Reverend D.T. Clinton and some of his McKinley teachers; won soloist award at Southern University competition; favorite teachers; after graduation, enlisted in air force; importance of McKinley in educating black professionals and politicians; Dolores Spikes, president at Southern University, was in Jefferson's class; participated in civil rights march from Southern University to State Capitol; platoon system where McKinley students only attended for half a day; division of students between McKinley and Capitol High; advances in technology since his time at McKinley, including computers and air conditioning; hopes current McKinley students will later give back to neighborhood and city; lived close to Baton Rouge High, but couldn't attend because he was black; recommends other people to interview.
